What about Pentecost? Acts 2:42

Dear Church Family,

When God's Spirit moved at Pentecost, the Holy Spirit appeared as tongues of fire. That is truly astonishing. The Apostle Peter's sermon brought conviction and commitment to more than 3,000 people. But, might I be so bold as to suggest that these spiritual encounters don't include the most miraculous development of all?

The 3,000 people who experienced God and re-

sponded to the gospel did not return home. Instead, they encouraged their loved ones to come and be a part of God's great outpouring. The church began with pilgrims who stayed in Jerusalem. What could have possibly caused them to make such a dramatic life change?

I believe the answer is that we all do amazing things when we fall in love. The first converts fell in love with God and with each other. They found what they had been searching for all their lives. The new life of Jesus always demands a new lifestyle, and this new lifestyle centered a few areas of life the church lived into

1. The Apostles' Teaching

This new reality brings about a hunger for God's Word. New disciples must be taught how to listen to, study and live out Scripture. When the new converts entered into the daily life of the Jerusalem church, they knew very little Scripture. Can you imagine how the hearts of those in the early church burned

within when they went to their regular teaching times and Peter began speaking?

Like the first converts at Pentecost, new Christians must be taught God's Word. And they must not only learn, but also apply and practically live out God's Word—tasting and seeing that the Lord is good, so that their faith will be strong and their lives will bear fruit.


The church began with devotion to God's Word.

2. Fellowship

The church was devoted to fellowship. Some 3,000

Trying to keep up with the younger generation and the music they love and listen to is indeed a challenge. But so worth the investment of time and energy. Some of our very youngest are asking to sing with the praise team when they know the music. In fact, the past 3 Sundays the 11:00am service folks have seen our elementary kids leading the music with the adults!

However, some of you have favorites that you have sung in church for years and those have not been chosen lately as part of the 8:00 or 9:30 services.

Knowing what your favorites are would be extremely helpful when choosing future music. Not sure if you even notice but when I play offertory solos, that solo is often sparked by the comments Ruffin makes just before the offering plates are passed. Other times by the sermon from the previous service, but the goal is to play music that will lead your heart in worship as you give your gifts back to God. This would also be a great place for your favorite song!

Many of you have asked for the quartet to sing more often. Those guys love the Lord and love to sing but rehearsal time is difficult to come by with new grand fathers no longer in town on weekends and work schedules during the week. But we are trying to find dates to catch everyone here! So hang in there!


